## CLEANING and STORING CATHETERS, CONES and SYRINGES

**Guidelines for nurses** 

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## 1) Cleaning and storing the catheter and syringe

- > Wash the outside of the catheter with water
- > Rinse catheter 3 times with water and blow air through to remove excess water
- Shake the catheter as dry as possible, leave it to dry in the sun when possible and store between a clean piece of cloth. Iron the cloth beforehand
- Syringe: wash with water and use air to remove excess water. Store disconnected parts
- Catheters should be replaced every 3 months





## 2) Bowel washout set: cone + bag + tube

Good maintenance of the washout set prolongs the life span of the material and avoids infections.

A bowel washout set consists of:



Cone



Tube with clip



Complete set with reservoir

1. <u>Cleaning after each use:</u>

> Clean all parts of the set after each use: wash with water and soap and rinse several times with water

- Let all parts dry completely
- 2. <u>Periodical cleaning:</u>
- > To avoid fungus, it is advised to clean the sets more thoroughly every month
- Use a solution of water with bleach/chlorine
- Rinse with clean water and let dry completely
